Nighttime Removal of Woodward Avenue Bridge in New Haven **RESCHEDULED** for January 24 and January 25

The Connecticut Department of Transportation (ConnDOT) has announced that the removal of the Woodward Avenue Bridge in New Haven is scheduled as part of the widening and reconstruction of I-95. The removal operations, which will affect I-95 Northbound and I-95 Southbound in New Haven/East Haven between Exit 50 and Exit 51, have been rescheduled and will now occur **between 12:01a.m. and 5:00a.m. on Tuesday, January 24 and also Wednesday, January 25, 2006.** Work will occur weather permitting.

Traffic on I-95 Northbound and I-95 Southbound between Exit 50 and Exit 51 will be halted for 5-10 minute intervals several times each night to protect drivers, passengers and pedestrians during the bridge removal operation.

The work is part of Contract C2 of the I-95 New Haven Harbor Crossing Corridor Improvement Program and is being performed by O & G Industries of Torrington, Connecticut. Contract C2 is located in New Haven and consists of the reconstruction of approximately one mile of I-95 just east of Stiles Street in New Haven to the New Haven/East Haven town line. Construction is scheduled to be completed in June 2009.
