Intermittent Nighttime Closure of I-95 near Exit 50 (Woodward Avenue) in New Haven Scheduled for September 27 & 28

The Connecticut Department of Transportation (ConnDOT) is announcing that the removal of the existing structural steel for the Woodward Avenue Bridge in New Haven is scheduled to occur on **Wednesday, September 27 and Thursday, September 28 from 9:00p.m. to 6:00a.m.** The work will affect one lane in each direction of I-95 Northbound and I-95 Southbound near Exit 50 (Woodward Avenue). The work is subject to rescheduling if weather conditions are not favorable for the operation.

Traffic on I-95 Northbound and I-95 Southbound near Exit 50 (Woodward Avenue) will be halted for 10-minute intervals several times overnight between 12 midnight until 5:00 a.m. to protect drivers, passengers and pedestrians while the work is performed.

The work is part of Contract C2 of the I-95 New Haven Harbor Crossing Corridor Improvement Program. Contract C2 is located in New Haven and consists of the reconstruction of approximately one mile of I-95 just east of Stiles Street in New Haven to the New Haven/East Haven town line. Construction is scheduled to be completed in June 2009.
